RULES:

Prepare a ball of paper.
Stay in your seat.
Do not throw paper in the bin unless instructed.

INSTRUCTIONS:

Step 1: Look at the recycling bin. It represents your ability to be successful in life. Everyone in class represents society.

Step 2: For this activity, everyone has a chance to be successful. All you have to do is remain in your seat and wait for the signal to aim and throw your ball of paper.

Step 3: Your teacher or facilitator will count to three. Only then you can throw your paper in the bin.

POINTS TO PONDER:

Who among the group succeeded and failed?

Do you think the instructions were fair for everyone? Why or Why not?

How would you relate this exercise to our society?

What do you now think about the concept of privilege?

Ready? Three... two... one... throw!
